The events they organise will be to support fundraising for these charities. Their next event is the Halloween Disco and Movies on the afternoon of Friday 27th October.










Millport - Environmental Science Trip



Our Higher Environmental Science pupils completed another successful trip to Millport this year and were fantastic ambassadors for the school. Pupils worked closely with the Field Studies Council over 3 days to develop their practical skills in biodiversity sampling. This included small mammal traps, surveys of the rocky shore and soil sampling in the woods. As a result, our pupils now have some really interesting and meaningful data to use in their assignments.




