1 Welcome & Apologies

JC opened the meeting and welcomed the attendees. SG advised of apologies received.

3. Minutes

The Minutes of the last PC Meeting held 13th November 2023 were approved.

4. Head Teacher's report

<u>Staffing</u>

LC advised she is working on the annual staffing return, which looks at staffing for session 2024-25. This is a complex piece of work as it relies on knowing information about staff and their working preferences in terms of hours as well as pupil options. The timetable needs to be built around staffing but staffing also informs what GHS can do with the timetable.

Mrs Martin is currently off sick with LC covering part of her remit and other staff are covering some other aspects. Parents and carers of Brodie pupils have been informed of the temporary arrangements. LC advised they are continuing to juggle the science timetable with long-term absence being an issue. It will be the February weekend at the earliest before things start to improve.

2. Uniform

LC met with a representative from Schoolwear Made Easy before the holidays to discuss some possible updates to GHS uniform. LC advised they are really battling with the standard of uniform and it causes LC a lot of concern when it is becoming more and more apparent amongst young people about the socio-economic divide in the community. Samples of the new uniform pieces were shown to the PC members and will be launched for the new session. LC advised they have also agreed to look at the senior blazers as the current design is still a traditional cord embroidery around the edges. To change to the tape ribbon design would make each blazer £10 cheaper.

The costs for the new items are: ½ zip top £19.95
Full zip hoodie £19.95
Hoodie £17.95
Blazer with tape £49.95

LC's plan is to do a lot of promotion around these items and make a real push on uniform after Easter so parents and carers are well informed about what is available. Schoolwear Made Easy also donated some red ¼ zips for PE.

<u>National 5 Prelims</u> – LC advised these ran without any issue, smoothly organised by Mr Gould, Mrs Foley and the invigilation team and that the Higher and Advanced Higher prelims are underway.

<u>Christmas Concert</u> – another fabulous night run by the music department and involving the talent of Gleniffer High with pupils doing a great job of getting everyone into the Christmas spirit.
