Attendance

Attendance is a crucial component of academic achievement. Regular attendance is vital for maintaining momentum in learning and understanding the material across the four subjects that each student is required to study, alongside wider achievement activities which may include volunteering and extracurricular involvement. However, for those studying Advanced Higher subjects, we understand that they may focus on three subjects in total, given the rigorous nature of this level of self-driven study required.

Leadership Opportunities

We are delighted to offer several leadership opportunities for our S6 pupils. These opportunities are afforded as representatives of the school community and as such, conduct in and outside of school must be to the highest standard to be considered for any of these roles:

The Student Leadership Team plays a pivotal role in representing our school at various events, meeting visitors, developing fundraising initiatives, and organising significant school functions. such as the Prom and Snobal, as well as supporting charitable causes like Children in Need. Members are held to high expectations of excellence in their conduct and commitment, and it is important that these responsibilities do not interfere with their academic attainment.
